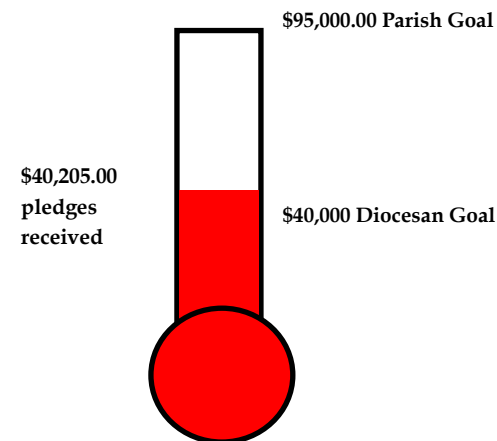

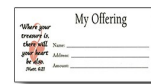
New Initiatives for St. John the Apostle Parish

Saintly aunt prayed for Leonie

Marie Leonie Martin's process for canonization was officially started on July 2, 2015. She was an older sister of St. Therese of Lisieux. Leonie was born on June 3, 1863 in Alencon, and was baptized the next day.

Leonie's physical health was very poor. Azelie (Zelie), told her sister, Sister Marie-Dosithée (a Visitation nun), about the illnesses of her daughter Leonie. Sister Marie-Dosithée wrote to Azelie suggesting that she make a novena to St. Margaret Mary, then blessed, for a cure for Leonie's illnesses. Azelie made a novena to then Blessed Margaret Mary and made this statement during her novena: “If Leonie is to become a saint one day, then cure her.” After the novena Leonie's condition improved.

When Leonie got older, Azelie, through the influence of Sister Marie-Dosithée, sent Leonie to the Visitation boarding school in Le Mans where her two older sisters were already studying. However, Leonie was sent home due to her resistance to learning and her sudden outbursts. Sister Marie-Dosithée felt that even though it was difficult to teach Leonie, she felt that Leonie was a “child of destiny”. She also thought that one day Leonie would become a nun in the Visitation convent.

After being tutored by two retired teachers for a little while, Azelie decided to take upon the task of teaching Leonie herself and also teaching her the Catechism for her First Holy Communion.

Leonie spent a lot of time alone in her bedroom and a lot of time with the maid, Louise Marais. Leonie's family suspected something was bothering her but they could not figure out what it was. Leonie's behavior would change drastically from being a pleasant child to being an unruly child.

In the fall of 1876, Azelie found out that her sister had tuberculosis. In December of the same year, Azelie told her family that she had breast cancer. In January 1877, Azelie went to visit Sister Marie-Dosithée for the last time. Azelie asked her sister when she went to heaven, to ask Our Lady for help correcting Leonie's behavior.

Leonie wanted to write a letter to Sister Marie-Dosithée before she died. Leonie wrote: “My dear Aunt, when you get to heaven, will you please ask the good God, if He pleases, to give me the grace to be converted and also to give me the vocation of becoming a true religious, for I think of that every day.” Leonie's older sister, Marie asked what she meant about being a “true religious”. Leonie replied: “A true religious is one who becomes a saint and I wish to become a saint.”

On February 24, 1877, Sister Marie-Dosithée died. A couple weeks later, the secret of Leonie's behavior was finally coming to the surface. Marie, the older sister of Leonie, noticed that Leonie was very good when she was around the maid, Louise, but very bad when she was around her mother. Marie investigated and discovered that Louise had gained total control over Leonie and was terrorizing and beating her. The only person that Leonie was to obey was Louise. After learning the truth, Azelie forbade Louise to have any contact with Leonie.

Once the secret had surfaced, Leonie's behavior quickly changed for the better. Azelie and Leonie's relationship had blossomed beautifully. Azelie described to her brother: “I cannot help thinking that this transformation is due to the prayers of our saintly sister, for all was altered two to three weeks after her death. It is she who has obtained for me the grace to know how to act so as to win Leonie's affections, and I hope God will let me finish my task, which is far from being completed as yet.”

Azelie taught Leonie about “gentleness, kindness, and then detachment from pleasure, the determination to give pleasure, no matter at what cost to the good Jesus.”
