ST. JOHN PAUL II

Exactly 40 years ago, September 1984, St. John Paul II came to Vancouver for his papal visit. Listen to him again what he told us then:

"The grace we receive in Baptism raises the quality of our life to a level far exceeding anything we could ever imagine for we receive the pledge of eternal or everlasting life. This everlasting life begins now; through faith in the word of God and through the Sacraments of the Church, it will reach its completion in the world to come."

"True living is not found in one's self or in things. It is found in someone else, in the One who created everything that is good, true, and beautiful in the world.

True living is found in God, and you discover God in the person of Jesus Christ. Christ reveals God to us, and to know Christ is to know God."

"When you wonder about the mystery of your life, look to Christ who explains to you its full meaning. When you wonder about the life to come, look to Christ.

Love him and serve him in your neighbour now, so that the fullness of eternal life may one day be yours."
